

The Family Resource Center at Park Avenue Elementary School is here to support students and their families in a variety of ways. At the meetings, they plan the School Spirit Day, decide who is going to receive the monthly Super Panther award, and who will assist the principals in handing out the Student of the Month Awards. They attend all three assemblies, one Friday a month, and are great ambassadors of spirit, leading the Panther Cheer with enthusiasm.

For our local Animal Shelter, students have participated in a variety of activities. In December, we sold Holiday Hats for one dollar each, donating over one hundred dollar to the Animal Shelter. During Winter Break, students got to hand over their earnings, and had a private tour of the shelter. After break, students came back and started collecting

supplies for the shelter. Thru the kindness of our families and staff, we were able to donate three boxes bulging with supplies, and they got a visit from Animal Shelter officers along with Layla, a malamute that was kind enough to take a picture with each student. Our final activity will combine Kindness Week with our Animal Shelter project. Students will sell PAWSOME bracelets for one dollar each, and all monies will be presented to the shelter at the May 22nd Board Meeting.

Our students have a lot of heart, and they have demonstrated this year that their heart extends beyond Park Avenue. I will miss this year's fifth graders as they go off to middle school; I am already anticipating next year's Student Council and their contribution to our world here at Park Avenue and beyond!
